ECHOES FROM THE PAST

(Extracts from Centenary History 1986)

Following a lapse of activities in 1929-30 the Coolera Club was re-organised the following year at a meeting in Knocknarea N.S., at which the following officers were elected: Joseph Roddy (Chairman); Frank Harte (Secretary) and Tom Waters (Treasurer). Committee members included Michael Gilligan, Jack Kilfeather, Denis Bree, Bob Milne and Charles Martyn. It was decided to enter a team in the Café Cairo Cup competition and efforts were to be made to acquire a suitable field for training and the playing of home fixtures The competition commenced with a home game against Grange on April 12th in Cooney's Field and the team lined out as follows: Mick Devaney. Peter Cunningham. Mick Waters, Owen Waters, Paddy Neary, Jim Carty, Johnny Carty, Paddy Martyn, Charlie Martyn, Dinny Feeney, Pa. Nelson, Tommy Kilfeather, Paddy Bree, Christie Curran and Paddy O'Connor.

The Golf Links Hotel, Strandhill, was the venue for the Coolera Annual Social and presentation of medals on Friday March 10th, 1972. Upwards of 120 guests enjoyed a gala occasion which had everything – an excellent meal, witty and to the point speeches and a musical programme of the highest quality.

After the sumptuous repast Club Chairman, Robert Nelson, opened the verbal proceedings by congratulating the junior team on winning both the North Division and the County Championship the previous year. The Chairman of the Co. Board, Brendan McCauley, also joined in congratulating the team on their success before presenting the County and Divisional Board medals, suitably inscribed. The club Secretary, Peter Cooney, was the recipient of an electric clock presented by Noel Lindsay on behalf of the team members.

At the A.G.M. in January 1977 the Coolera Club made history as for the first time since its formation ninety years earlier a lady officer was appointed in the person of Alice Lindsay as Treasurer. The meeting which drew the largest attendance for years opened proceedings in candlelight due to a power cut. In his Report, club secretary, Peter Cooney, reviewed a very successful season the highlight of which was its success at Scór, winning three divisional, two county and one provincial title.

A motion from the floor that the Club should consider introducing a "Player of the Year" and "Clubman of the Year" annual awards was unanimously agreed.

The following officers were appointed: Tom Gilligan (Chairman); Jimmy Brennan (Vice-Chairman); Peter Cooney (Secretary). Tommy Kelly (Assistant Secretary) and Alice Lindsay (Treasurer). Other appointments included John Kivlehan (senior captain)' George Lindsay (junior captain) and Brendan McCauley (club coach).

Coolera/Strandhill, under the joint management of Neil Carew and John McPartland, enjoyed an undefeated run in the U-20 football championship played in October/November.

In the opening round at Ransboro Park they scored a comfortable 3-9 to 0-7 win over Calry/St. Josephs. This was followed by a closely contested away game against St. Molaise Gaels, winning by 1-10 to 1-7. Curry, with a home venue, provided daunting opposition in the third and final round in Group (A) played in unfavourable weather conditions. The visitors rose to the task with admirable determination and were level at 0-4 each at half time. The second half remained scoreless until substitute, Keith Devaney, fired home a late goal to put his side ahead and victory by 1-4 to 0-4. With this success Coolera/Strandhill, as winners of Group (A), qualified to meet Tubbercurry, winners of Group (B), in the Final played at Tourlestrane.

Entering the last quarter the Coolera lads rallied strongly and points by Padraig Gaughan and 1-1 from the boot of Ciaran Brenan narrowed the gap and provided an exciting finish which culminated in an injury time goal from Barry O'Mahonyand a merited victory in a well contested game.
