Background;

Sligo GAA Underage Development sets out to support and develop players to achieve their full potential. This is co-ordinated via development squads and coaching supports for clubs. The holder of this position will report to the Games Development Officer and the Sligo Underage Football Development Governance Committee.

Objectives;

The primary objectives of Sligo Underage Football Development Squad Coaches are;

- (1) To oversee the development of underage players and to deliver a consistent approach to all players in terms of individual and team development.
- (2) To co-ordinate and deliver, a high quality coaching programme for the Sligo underage Development GAA Squads in accordance with our development and performance philosophy.

Duties and Responsibilities;

- Put in place and manage a coaching and background team to create an environment to develop and support a high quality coaching programme to maximise the development of players,
- Plan and coordinate the season schedule of activities with the Sligo GAA Football and Games Development Officer and Club Coaching officers,
- Manage the planning, preparation and delegation and delivery of coaching sessions and coordination of activities for the panel,
- Provide strong leadership and encourage a supportive team environment which provides appropriate mentoring, support and guidance to all coaches, players and volunteers,
- Plan, prepare, deliver and evaluate quality and appropriate coaching to cater for all players of varying abilities,
- Provide an enjoyable and safe sporting experience for an assigned group of players while they learn individual and team game skills, sportsmanship, and fair play,
- Be aware of and promote the GAA codes of conduct for coaches, players and parents at all times, abide by, and promote sound ethics equal opportunities to all participants,

- Ensure all participants are aware of the aims of each coaching session and the rationale of every endeavour and the objectives that are been achieved,
- Develop a positive working relationship and encourage strong links and communication with the Games Development Officer to ensure he is aware of all activities throughout the season,
- Ensure all associated costs are within agreed budgets for the season and a system put in place where items of expenditure are forwarded to the Games Development Officer for approval first,
- Develop positive relationships with clubs, in particular underage club mentors, to ensure that there are regular, appropriate and competitive opportunities for members,
- Committed to ongoing continued professional development by attending coach education courses and any in-service training that is organised by the Games Development officer,
- Provide positive and detailed feedback to participants and to those who did not meet the criteria,
- Take responsibility for ensuring that all equipment provided is made available for the completion of the coaching programme and is maintained to a high standard,
- Develop positive relationships with parents to promote the participation of players and to ensure they are aware of the key objectives,
- Co-operate with any media engagement and attend events as requested by Sligo GAA and promote and increase awareness within Sligo and externally of underage development work via the delivery of a robust public relations campaign,
- Monitor and evaluate all sessions, activities and programmes and provide the Underage development committee with concise progress reports linked to agreed work programmes.
