The GAA accepts this responsibility as a core element of our duty to care for young people. The prevention and detection of child abuse depends on the collaborative effort of everyone concerned and on the implementation of good practice policies and guidance in our Association. The following factors are central to effective child protection in sport and are values that you will have to adhere to while delivering the Gaelic Games Child Welfare & Protection Awareness in Sport Programme:

- ✓ Acceptance by all involved with young people that abuse, whether physical, psychological or sexual is wrong, severely damages children and must be confronted
- ✓ Awareness of the behavioural and physical indicators of various forms of abuse
- ✓ Knowledge of the appropriate response within the GAA and action to be taken where abuse is revealed or suspected
- √ Vigilance and avoidance of all situations conducive to risk
- ✓ Open, trusting and co-operative relationships within the club/organisation, and with parents/guardians and others concerned with children's progress or welfare
- ✓ Willingness to co-operate with Statutory Authorities (police authorities and health boards), in relation to sharing information about child protection concerns at any time.
